Vision:

Having been part of the Surrey, British Columbia Community for over 50 years, we have seen how important it is for kids to play in a healthy and safe environment. Our goal is to provide that opportunity to all kids and families regardless of personal, societal or economic barriers.

Members of the Singh Foundation have been active volunteer youth coaches in the community for 20+ years.

Objective:

The Singh Foundation provides funding, guidance and program support for individuals and community groups in need with a specific focus on Youth. Our programs are focused in British Columbia, Canada with a large focus in the City of Surrey. We establish partnerships with groups such as the Surrey Schools, the R.C.M.P and Jumpshot Generosity, where we can deploy resources for innovative new programs and to support existing established programs.

2024 Year in review

2024 was another busy year for the Foundation with \$138,931 of funding placed directly into the community.

Jumpshot Generosity received \$72,400 in funding to complete several after-school programs and Supercamps. These



programs allow kids to play and learn valuable basketball and social skills. Participants also receive new basketball shoes a t-shirt and food for the day.



Surrey Schools received \$42,000 in funding for six schools. The funds impacted 9,072 students of 83,000 students in the district representing approximately 9.1% of the students in

surrey schools. This includes a yearly commitment to two \$1000 scholarships for the Surrey RCMP Basketball Classic. Funding was used in part for:

Other Programs:

The Foundation sponsored a series of half-day educational Horse Archery experiences for local Youth. The participants engaged in hands-on archery training, including handling of equines on the ground, practical grooming, composite bow training. We are pleased with the program and have agreed to sponsor additional programs in the next year.

This is a unique and rare opportunity for Youth to engage in a historical Martial Art while understanding the relationship between horses and humans.





Financial Summary

As of December 31, 2024, a total revenue including new donations, interest and dividends of \$217,700 was realized with expenses totalling 138,931.

The Foundation has consistently reduced administrative expenses since its inception. While the startup year required the highest administrative costs, by 2024 these expenses represented only about 2% of the overall budget



The short-term investment fund has grown to \$3,100,845 from \$3,031,272 at the end of 2023.
